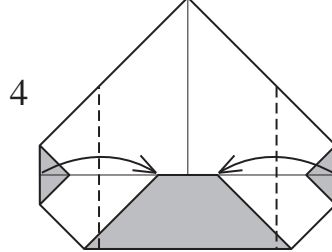
Valley-fold and unfold diagonally in half.



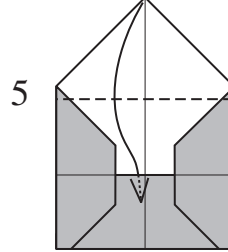
Valley-fold three corners in more or less the same amount.



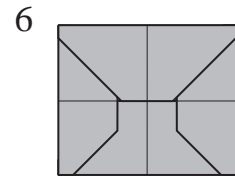

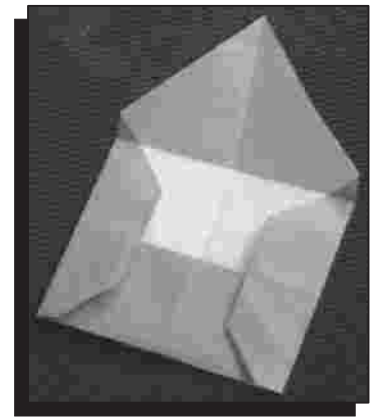


Valley-fold the top flap sticking the end inside the envelope.

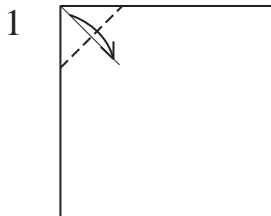

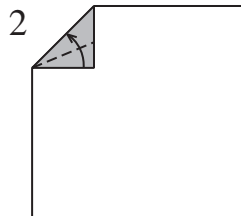
Kite Letterhead

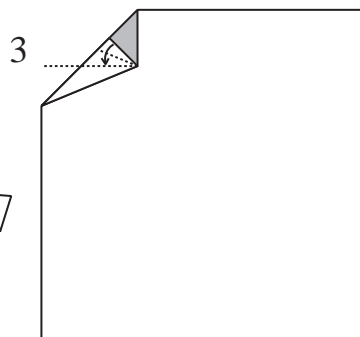
This model is great to fold on a windy day for if you let it go in the right wind, the kite will really fly.....away.



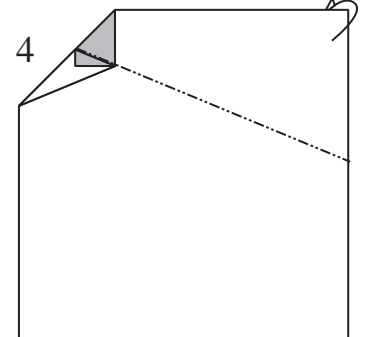
White side up. Valley-fold corner to taste.... a bigger flap will make a bigger kite.



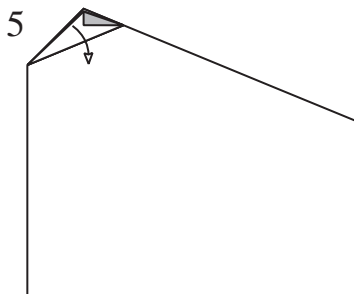
Valley-fold edge to edge.



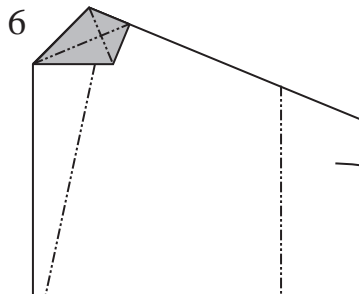
Valley-fold so the edge goes horizontal.



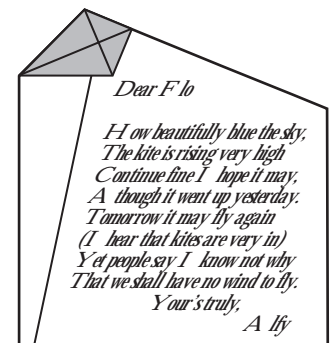
Mountain-fold the top behind.

The completed Kite Letterhead, ready to be lettered with writing.

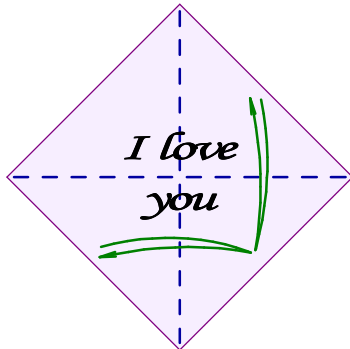

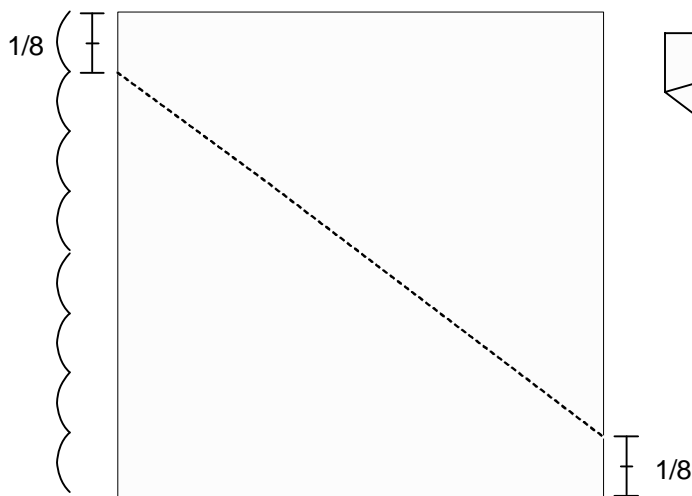


Two Fold Angelfish by J.C. Nolan (Jan '95)

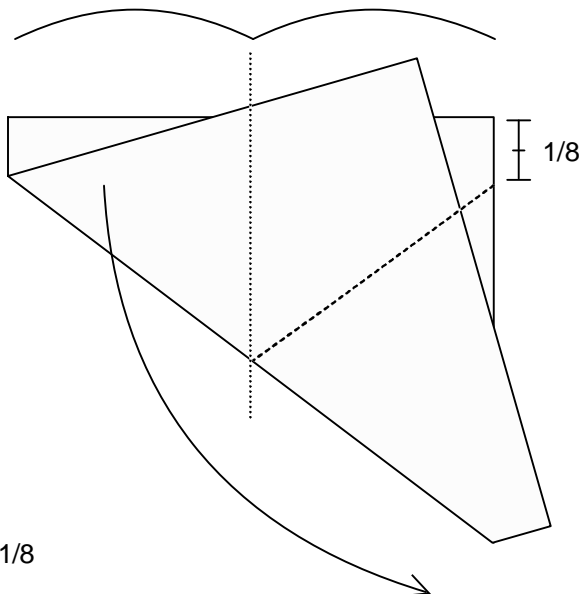

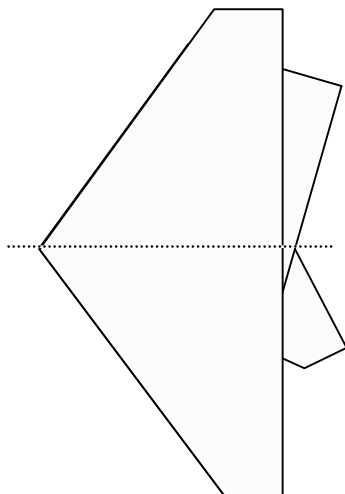
Fold from a square of paper colored the same on both sides. If two-color paper is used start with the colored side down for a predominantly white model. A 4" piece of paper produces a model 4" high.



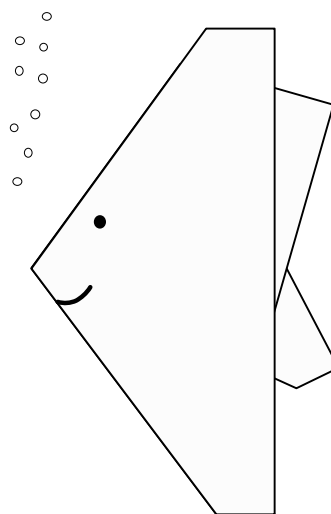
1. Please note, the extra symbols are for those who prefer having landmarks. Feel free to estimate.
